

BRED & FED Competition



About

Box Elder County has a rich history of cow/calf production, and the calves shown at the Box Elder Junior Livestock Sale represent a significant number of the total ranches in the county.

To honor this history and recognize those producing excellent cattle, Western AgCredit has created a Bred and Fed in Box Elder County competition. The intent of the competition is to recognize ranching families that bring their home-raised calves to the fair. Exhibitors who have purchased a calf born in Box Elder County to feed are also eligible.

How to Enter

At weigh-in on Tuesday, August 20th beginning at 9:00 a.m., a Western AgCredit representative will be present. Sign the affidavit stating that your steer meets the criteria outlined, and you'll be entered in the competition.

Winner Selection

The winner of the Bred and Fed in Box Elder County competition will be the highest placing calf in the market class meeting the rules as outlined.

Rules



The calf must have been born in Box Elder County.



Calves can leave the county for summer grazing if the ranch's headquarters is in Box Elder County.



After the calf is weaned, it must be fed in Box Elder County.



The exhibitor must adhere to all Rules and Policies stated by the Box Elder County Junior Livestock Sale Committee.



The exhibitor signs an affidavit confirming the above rules are met at the final weigh-in for the Box Elder County Junior Livestock Sale.

\$1,500 Prize!

The winning exhibitor will be awarded **\$1,500** in prize money, and the exhibitor and breeder will also receive custom jackets.
